







48.93% of the households in Fort Collins are Renter Occupied. 51.7 % are owner occupied









Lack of Supply:

Most existing homes were not designed to current standards of safety, health, and accessibility.

Lack of Awareness:


Homebyers and homeowners are not thinking about lifelong design, either because they are not thinking ahead to when their life circumstances options. will require accessibility accommodations.

Lack of Demand:


Homebuyers are not requesting lifelong homes and thus, developers and builders are not building them.

Lack of Incentives:

Municipalities are aware of the need for lifelong housing but are struggling to raise awareness and unaware that such options exist or because they are incentivize the development of better housing
